Prevention and Partnership

In this edition of our newsletter, we are recognizing residents, professionals, and our prevention and harm reduction partners who have responded to substance misuse throughout Michigan and beyond our state borders.

Early this month, the Michigan Poison & Drug Information Center (MiPDC) issued a public warning about the possible presence of fentanyl in cocaine following a reported overdose event in Calhoun County on Thanksgiving Day. More than ten individuals were affected. All victims survived thanks to prompt treatment by emergency responders and the use of naloxone, the opioid overdose reversal agent. This was the second reported overdose event in 2023 in Michigan. This April, fentanyl-laced cocaine was linked to 18 overdoses in Kalamazoo County over two days, resulting in seven deaths.

Public Response to Warning on Opioid Overdose Prevention

Following our warning earlier this month, we were inundated with requests for naloxone kits and educational materials in Michigan and even several other US states. Many requests were accompanied by personal experiences with drug overdoses. These stories highlighted the importance of preparedness in responding to a drug overdose.

We are always willing to supply materials and information to anyone living and working in Michigan, but many more agencies are also working to prevent and reduce harm related to substance misuse. The MiPDC Coalition for Poison Prevention is a statewide coalition that works with the Prevention Network in Michigan. We also work with the Michigan Department of Health and Human Services division for Substance Use, Gambling, and Epidemiology (SUGE), a division where residents can locate prevention, treatment, and recovery services available in their counties.

Community Action Agencies play a major role in providing services and assistance to residents in their counties as well. We regularly participate in activities and events with the Oakland Livingston Human Services Agency (OLHSA) and the Detroit Wayne Integrated Health Network (DWIHN). 
Highlights from the North American Congress of Clinical Toxicology (NACCT) 2023

NACCT 2023 Main Congress took place in Montreal, Quebec, from September 29 through October 1 at the Fairmount The Queen Elizabeth Hotel.

Poster Presentations:

Brandtly Yakey, D.O., Medical Toxicologist, and Omid Mehrpour, M.D., Specialist in Poison Information with the MiPDC, presented study findings on intentional ingestions of antidepressants and decongestants, outcomes on salicylate poisonings (Aspirin), treatments for pediatric exposure to antifreeze, and the physical effects from ethylene glycol after treatment after large ingestions of antifreeze.









The MiPDC and New York City Poison Center educators worked collaboratively to survey and present their findings regarding the legal status of cannabis in each US state and territory. They also discussed public education efforts and collaborations with each poison center, as well as the federal forecast on legalization and restrictions related to cannabis sales and use.
